Proposals may be hand delivered or sent via U.S. Mail or private carrier. Oral, FAX, or other forms of bid will not be accepted. All proposals become the property of the Fire District and will not be returned. Mailed bids which are delivered after the specified hour will not be accepted regardless of postmarked time on the envelope. Bidders should carefully consider all bid delivery options (US Postal Service, UPS, Federal Express, private delivery service, etc.) and select a method that will successfully deliver their bid by the required time and date. Bids shall be submitted in **sealed envelopes or boxes**. In addition to the Bidder's completed and signed *Bid Sheet* the Bidder shall assure all items below have been included with their bid submittal. Failure to provide these requirements with submittal may be cause for rejection of the bid.

NOTICE OF WITHDRAWL

Any bid may be withdrawn provided notice is delivered to the Fire District at the same location as the bid was delivered and is on company letterhead of the bidder by an authorized representative prior to the due date and time stated above.

SAMPLE SCBA

With each submitted bid shall be one (1) SCBA with cylinder and both a medium and large facepiece of the model bid which may be used by the Fire District for non-live fire training in order to evaluate performance. The Fire District will not be responsible for normal wear and tear that may occur during its evaluation. Failure to submit the sample SCBA may be cause for rejection of the bid. It will remain the bidder's responsibility to contact the Fire District following the award of contract to arrange pick-up of their sample SCBA.

OPENING OF PROPOSALS

All received proposals will be opened and contents read at 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, May 31.

REVIEW OF PROPOSALS

Sometime after the opening of the proposals the Fire District will review each bid. This will be done as time permits Fire District staff. The Fire District reserves the right to reject any or all bids and/or to waive any irregularities or disregard any informality in the bids and bidding when, in its opinion, the best interest of the Fire District will be served by such action. Furthermore, the Fire District reserves the right to award each item to a different Bidder, or all items to a single Bidder unless otherwise noted on the *Bid Sheet*. The Fire District may determine as follows: 1) an equal or alternative is a satisfactory substitute; 2) an early delivery date is entitled to more consideration than price; 3) an early delivery date is to be disregarded because of the reputation of the Bidder for not meeting delivery dates; 4) a Bidder is not a responsible Bidder; and 5) what exceptions or deviations from written specifications will be accepted. As part of the bid review these specifications will be used to develop a ranking of features in part and/or in whole and that ranking may be a factor in the selection and award of the bid.

LEGAL RIGHT TO SPECIFY

The Prospect Heights Fire Protection District (for the remainder of this section referred to as the "specifier") chooses to exercise its Legal Right to Specify as determined by the U.S. Supreme Court's affirmation of the decision handed down in the case of Whitten Corp. vs. Paddock, by the U.S. District Court of Massachusetts, the First Federal District Court, which in effect states:

- That as trained professionals, specifiers make informed judgments on products that they
 feel best serve their needs. Also, that proprietary specifications (if chosen) DO NOT violate
 any antitrust laws. Technically, very few brands of material or equipment are exactly alike,
 and if the specifier wants to limit the specification to one source, he has the right to do so
 and enforce it.
- 2. Only the specifier has the responsibility and judgment for determining whether a proposed substitution is an "or equal".
- 3. That from start to finish in the purchasing process, only the specifier can ultimately decide if another desirable product is available in lieu of the specification.
- 4. Finally, that the courts concluded <u>"the burden is on the supplier or manufacturer, who has NOT been specified, to convince the specifier that their product is equal for the purpose of a particular project".</u>

The specifier has determined that this product specification shall represent the product to which all offerings shall be compared. Due to the fact that firefighting is an ULTRAHAZARDOUS, UNAVOIDABLY DANGEROUS activity, only trained Fire Department personnel with specific knowledge in the area of Personal Protective Equipment shall be allowed to make the final determining decision on the selection of the appropriate product to serve the Fire Department's needs.

NEGOTIATION

The Fire District reserves the right to negotiate terms and conditions of proposals received prior to acceptance or rejection of any particular proposal.

SELECTION OF BID

No bid will be accepted from or contract awarded to any person, firm, or corporation that is in arrears or is in default to the Fire District upon any debt or contract, or that is a defaulter, as surety or otherwise, upon any obligation to the Fire District, or had failed to perform faithfully any previous contract with the Fire District.

After the due date for proposals, and after the Fire District staff has had sufficient time to adequately review each bid, conduct comparisons and, if necessary, negotiations with any bidders, the Fire District staff will forward its recommendation to the Board of Trustees of the Fire District who will then decide whether to accept or reject any bid.

The Board of Trustees of the Prospect Heights Fire Protection District reserves the right to reject any and all bids or to waive any technicalities, discrepancies, or information in the bids. The Prospect Heights Fire Protection District does not discriminate in admission, access to, treatment, or employment in its programs and activities.

DELIVERY

The order is to be shipped to the Prospect Heights Fire Protection District, 10 E Camp McDonald Rd., Prospect Heights, IL, 60070 with the bidder paying all shipping costs. The Fire District will not accept partial shipments. The complete order must be delivered as one package, all on the same date. The complete order shall be received within 60 days from date of order unless the vendor serves prior notice to the Fire District and the Fire District accepts the later delivery date. If the delivery is made by truck, arrangements must be made in advance by the Bidder, with concurrence by the Fire District, for receipt of the materials. Truck deliveries will only be accepted between 8:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. weekdays at the Prospect Heights Fire Protection District, 10 E Camp McDonald Rd., Prospect Heights, IL, 60070.

DOCUMENTATION TO BE SUPPLIED AT TIME OF DELIVERY

- 2) Care and maintenance instructions for each component
- 3) Warranty for each component
- 4) Quality assurance test for each individual SCBA delivered

INSPECTION UPON DELIVER

The Fire District shall have the right to inspect any materials, components, equipment, supplies, services, or completed work specified herein. Any of said items not complying with these specifications are subject to rejection at the option of the Fire District. Any items rejected shall be removed from the premises of the Fire District and/or replaced at the entire expense of the successful Bidder.

TRAINING

The bidder shall provide training for all members of the Fire District. The training shall instruct the Fire District personnel in the operation and maintenance of the SCBA. This training shall occur on each of the three shifts on days mutually agreeable to both the bidder and Fire District.

CONTRACT DOCUMENTS

Any drawings, plans, standard conditions, special conditions, supplemental additional conditions, specifications, RFP notice, bid sheet, and addendum, if any, as specified herein shall form the "Contract Documents." For the purpose of this RFP, the word "Fire District" shall refer to the Prospect Heights Fire Protection District, and the word "bidder" shall refer to any person, company, or entity submitting a proposal. Any work shown or described in one of the documents shall be construed as if described in all the documents.

TERMINATION OF CONTRACT

The Fire District reserves the right to terminate in whole or any part of this contract, upon written notice to the Bidder, in the event of default by the Bidder. Default is defined as failure of the Bidder to perform any of the provisions of this contract or failure to make sufficient progress so as to endanger performance of this contract in accordance with its terms. In the event of default and termination, the Fire District may procure, upon such terms and in such a manner as the Fire District may deem appropriate, supplies, or services similar to those terminated.

PAYMENT

The vendor will invoice the Fire District for the complete order on a single, itemized invoice. Upon receipt and acceptance of all items payment will be made within thirty (30) days by the Fire District's Board of Trustees.

BIDDER'S QUALIFICATIONS

No award will be made to any Bidder who cannot satisfy to the Fire District that they have sufficient ability and experience in this class of work, as well as sufficient capital and equipment to do the job and complete the work successfully within the time named (i.e. responsible). The Fire District's decision or judgment on these matters shall be final, conclusive, and binding. The Fire District may make such investigations as it deems necessary. The Bidder shall furnish to the Fire District, under oath if so required, all information and data the Fire District may request for the purpose of investigation.

PREPARATION OF PROPOSAL

The Bidder's submittal shall include the completed *Bid Sheet* found in the Contract Documents. The Fire District will strictly hold the Bidder to the terms of the bid. The bid must be executed by a person having the legal right and authority to bind the Bidder.

COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS

The Bidder shall at all times observe and conform to all laws, ordinances, and regulations of the Federal, State, and local governments, which may in any manner affect the preparation of bids or the performance of the contract.

ANTI-COLLUSION STIPULATION

By submitting a bid the bidder agrees that its proposal is made without any understanding, agreement or connection with any other person, firm or corporation making a bid for the same purpose and that its proposal is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud.

FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT (FOIA)

The Fire District is required by Public Act 96-542 to comply with freedom of information requests (FOIA) within five (5) business days of a record request. All contractors used by the Fire District may be in possession of records covered by this act and therefore will be required to provide the Fire District with those records upon request and within the time frame of the Act.

ALTERNATE TO BIDS

Any reference in these specifications to manufacturer's name, trade name, or catalog number (unless otherwise specified) is intended as a standard only. The Fire District's decision of approval or disapproval of a proposed substitution shall be final.

FORM OF CONTRACT

The form of contract between the Fire District and the successful Bidder will be a purchase order referencing the proposal specification and the bid submitted by the successful Bidder.

CONTRACT TERM

The initial term of this contract shall begin on the date of award subject, however, to the right of the Fire District to cancel and terminate the same at any time by giving a thirty (30) day notice in writing to the vendor. In the event of such cancellation, the vendor shall be entitled to receive payment for services and work performed and materials and equipment furnished under the terms of the contract prior to the effective date of such cancellation, but will not be entitled to receive any damages on account of such or any further payment whatsoever.

LIABILITY

The bidder, if its bid is accepted, shall defend any and all suits and assume all liability for the use of any patented process, device or article forming a part of the SCBA or any appliance furnished under the contract.

INTENT

Specification is for new, unused NFPA 1981 compliant SCBA and accessories. It is the intent of these specifications to cover the furnishing and delivery to the Fire District said SCBA and accessories as hereinafter specified. It should be noted that this specification is written around the specific needs of the Fire District. With a view to obtaining the best results and the most acceptable SCBA for service in the Fire District, these specifications cover only the general requirements with which the successful bidder must conform.

Proposals shall only be considered from companies that have an established reputation in the field of SCBA manufacturing. Each bidder shall furnish satisfactory evidence of its ability to construct the vehicle specified and shall state the location of the factory where the vehicle is to be built. Each bidder shall also show that it is in position to render prompt service and to furnish replacement parts for said vehicle.

COMPLIANCES

All SCBA and accessories shall be approved by the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH), under 42 CFR, Part 84 for chemical, biological, radiological, and nuclear protection (CBRN) with a 30-minute rated service life and compliant with all requirements of the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) 1981, *Standard* on Open-Circuit Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA) for Emergency Services, *2013 edition* and NFPA 1982, *Standard on Personal Alert Safety Systems (PASS), 2013 edition.* Only proposals for SCBA currently listed on the SEI website as approved to NFPA 1981-2013 will be accepted.

DETAILED SPECIFICATIONS

The following specification represents the District's minimum requirements for the purchase of Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus - SCBA. Alternate products offered must meet or exceed these requirements. Vendors who are interested in proposing "equal or better than" alternate products shall include detailed information on the proposed product with their bid submittal. The overall safety of the Fire District's firefighters and the perceived efficiency of its operations will weigh heavily in the final determination of the acceptability of alternate products during the review process and the Fire District's decision shall be final.

This purchase is funded with a 2014 DHS Assistance to Firefighters Grant for \$221,000. Prior to July, 2016 the Fire District will purchase the following quantities of SCBA, spare cylinders, facepieces, and accessories:

34 Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus with 30-minute, 4500-PSI cylinders and facepiece.

34 additional 30-minute, 4500-PSI cylinders.

34 additional facepieces

Modification of four existing MSA Rescueaire II to include second stage/breathing valve.

EFFECTIVE: 01 JAN 16

- 6. PROCEDURE:
- 6.1. Bid Dispute
- 6.1.1. Disputes will only be accepted for ten calendar days following the awarding of the bid or acceptance of the proposal.
- 6.1.2. Any dispute is to be addressed to the person listed in the bid or Request for Proposal specification as the point of contact.
- 6.1.3. Disputes may be submitted in person, by U.S. Mail, or by email.
- 6.1.4. A dispute must be made in writing and contain the following elements:
 - Legal name of the person submitting the dispute;
 - Name of the vendor or manufacturer the person submitting the dispute represents;
 - Address and phone number of the person submitting the dispute.
 - Title of the bid or RFP as listed on the specification.
- 6.1.5. The written dispute must clearly assert one or more issues with the process or award such as
 - Identification of the specific provision of the procurement document and/or procedure that was allegedly breached and the manner in which it was breached.
 - A precise statement of other relevant facts.
 - The complainant's arguments and supporting documentation.
 - The complainant's requested remedy.
- 6.1.6. Once received, the fire chief will appoint an investigator to perform fact finding. The investigator may be one or more persons or a committee. The investigator need not be a member of the fire district. The investigator may contact the person submitting the dispute should there be a need but is not obligated to do so. The investigator will submit the finding in a written report to the fire chief prior to the next regularly scheduled meeting of the Board of Trustees but no sooner than 14 days prior to the commencement of the investigation.
- 6.1.7. At the next regularly scheduled meeting of the Board of Trustees the finding will be presented by the fire chief or his designee. The Board may render a decision on the dispute at the same meeting or defer the matter to the next meeting. All decisions of the Board are final
